What to think about before you start

- Why are you writing this essay?
- What does it want me to do?
- How does it want me to do it?
- How am I going to do it?



Two Types of Essays

- 1 – You answer a question you have been given
- 2 – You write the question you are going to answer

Getting Started

- Essays are a significant learning experience
- Get ideas onto paper
- Talk to other students


- Using the following essay question, or use your own...

Analysis

- Delete the nonsense
- Are there any patterns?
- Use a mind map to organise these ideas
- The more you practice, the better you will become



Analysing an Essay Question

- Write the question out in full
- Underline the keywords
- Put the title in a circle
- Put the question into your own words
- Remember every word counts!

Questions

- **Topic** – *What, in general, do you have to write about?*
- **Focus** – *What particular aspect of the topic do you have to address?*
- **Question word** – *What do you have to do?*
- **Viewpoint** – *What do you need to support or challenge?*
